The IHCP updates FQHC and RHC encounter codes

Effective October 1, 2014, the Indiana Health Coverage Programs (IHCP) will add the following Current Procedural

Terminology (CPT^{®1}) code as a valid Federally Qualified Health Center (FQHC) and rural health clinic (RHC) encounter code:

0359T – Behavior identification assessment, by the physician or other qualified health care professional, face-to-face with patient and caregiver(s), includes administration of standardized and non-standardized tests, detailed behavioral history, patient observation and caregiver interview, interpretation of test results, discussion of findings and recommendations with the primary guardian(s)/ caregiver(s), and preparation of report



This change applies retroactively to dates of service (DOS) on or after **July 1, 2014**. Beginning October 1, 2014, FQHC and RHC providers may submit claims for this

code with DOS on or after July 1, 2014. Claims for this code with DOS on or after July 1, 2014, that previously denied may be resubmitted.

The list of valid FQHC and RHC encounter codes is reviewed periodically to provide updates related to new and enddated CPT and Healthcare Common Procedure Coding System (HCPCS) codes, and is available on the <u>Myers and</u> <u>Stauffer website</u> at in.mslc.com. Sign up now for the September 18, 2014, Hospital Presumptive Eligibility Qualified Provider Training



The Hospital Presumptive Eligibility (HPE) process allows acute care hospitals to make presumptive eligibility determinations so that certain eligibility groups can receive temporary healthcare coverage under the Indiana Health Coverage Programs (IHCP) until official eligibility can be determined. The HPE process allows IHCP providers (not just hospitals) to be reimbursed for covered services provided during this temporary period. Acute care hospitals are encouraged to have representatives participate in "Hospital Presumptive Eligibility Qualified Provider Training," an online webinar scheduled for September 18, 2014, 10 – 11:30 a.m. Although this webinar will not be the only HPE training session offered, it is the next available opportunity to receive the training necessary to become a QP. Representatives from eligible hospitals can register for the webinar from the <u>Workshop Registration</u> page at indianamedicaid.com by September 16, 2014. **Note**: When registering, be sure to include the hospital's National Provider Identifier (NPI), so the IHCP can activate the hospital's QP status after the training.

Hospitals participating in the training webinar are still required to complete the enrollment application and attestation online through Web interChange to enroll as QPs for HPE. Webinar attendance will be verified before activating a hospital's QP status. Acute care hospitals unable to participate but still interested in becoming an HPE QP can complete the enrollment and attestation online. They will then be scheduled for the required training at a later date.
