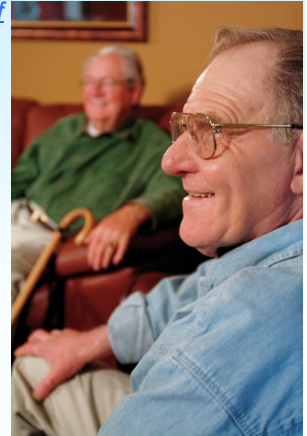

Corrections to DDRS HCBS Waiver Manual pending

The Indiana Health Coverage Programs (IHCP) recently published version 2.1 of the [Division of Disability and Rehabilitation Services \(DDRS\) Home and Community-Based Services \(HCBS\) Waiver Provider Manual](#) at indianamedicaid.com. This version was intended to update the manual with policies and procedures effective December 1, 2014. It has been discovered, however, that Table 6.2 under *Section 6.5: Translating Algo into a Budget Allocation* contains outdated rates.

Corrections to this table are in process. After the corrections have been made, the revised manual will be posted and notices sent via the DDRS LISTSERV and the IHCP email notification process.



Medicaid Rehabilitation Option (MRO) diagnosis codes updated



All Indiana Health Coverage Programs (IHCP) members who demonstrate a behavioral health need are eligible for clinic option services (405 IAC 5-20-8). However, only members with qualifying diagnoses and levels of need (LONs) are also eligible for a Medicaid Rehabilitation Option (MRO) service package.

The list of qualifying behavioral health ICD diagnosis codes associated with the MRO service package for children and adolescents has been updated to add diagnosis code 296.99 - *Disruptive mood dysregulation disorder*. This change applies retroactively to dates of service (DOS) on or after **January 1, 2015**.

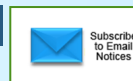
Refer to Appendix B of the [Medicaid Rehabilitation Option Provider Manual](#) at indianamedicaid.com for the updated list of qualifying diagnosis codes. A member must have at least one qualifying diagnosis from the list to be eligible for an MRO service package. As noted, adults and children or adolescents have unique qualifying diagnosis lists. Providers are reminded that they must enter the qualifying diagnosis for each member into the Division of Mental Health and Addiction (DMHA) Data Assessment Registry for Mental Health and Addiction (DARMHA) database for a service package to be assigned.
