PE and HPE qualified provider training scheduled for April and May

Acute care hospitals, freestanding psychiatric hospitals, Federally Qualified Health Centers (FQHCs), rural health clinics (RHCs), community mental health centers (CMHCs), and local county health departments interested in becoming qualified providers (QPs) for Presumptive Eligibility (PE) or Hospital Presumptive Eligibility (HPE) are invited to attend one of the following virtual training webinars. All sessions are from 10 a.m. – noon Eastern Time:

- Thursday, April 2
- Thursday, April 9
- Friday, April 17
- Wednesday, April 22
- Friday, May 1
- Tuesday, May 12
- Wednesday, May 27



To complete the QP enrollment process, providers with representatives attending one of these training webinars are required to complete the enrollment application and related attestations online through Web interChange. After that step is successfully completed, an HP Provider Relations consultant will verify webinar attendance and activate the provider's PE or HPE QP status.

Providers that do not have representatives attend one of these webinars but who are interested in becoming PE or HPE QPs can also complete the enrollment application and the required attestations online through Web interChange on or after April 1, 2015. Upon completion, an HP Provider Relations consultant will contact the provider to arrange training.



Eligible providers must document use of the Final Rule on CEHRT flexibility for Program Year 2014

Eligible providers participating in the Indiana Electronic Health Record (EHR) Incentive Program that plan to use the Final Rule on Certified Electronic Health Record Technology (CEHRT) flexibility for Program Year 2014 attestations must submit documentation to support their use of the Final Rule as part of their attestation.

Indiana's EHR Incentive Program will begin accepting these attestations on April 1, 2015. Documentation may vary for each provider, but all documentation should detail the reason for using the Final Rule on CEHRT flexibility and also trace back to the CEHRT vendor. Correspondence from the vendor is the preferred documentation, but letters or email correspondence between the practice and the vendor, explaining the issues and why attesting under the Final Rule is necessary, are also acceptable.



If the previous examples are not available, a signed letter from the practice's chief executive officer/chief financial officer (CEO/CFO), affirming that all requirements for using the Final Rule on CEHRT flexibility have been met and detailing issues that were encountered that justify using the Final Rule, is acceptable.


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
