NCCI code auditing methodology

Indiana Health Coverage Programs (IHCP) Banner Page [BR201119](#), dated January 25, 2011, announced that the IHCP would implement the National Correct Coding Initiative (NCCI) code auditing methodology. The IHCP began applying correct coding methodology to claims with dates of service (DOS) on or after October 1, 2010, as directed by the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services. This methodology includes mass adjusting claims when a provider incorrectly bills Column I and Column II codes on separate claims for the same member on the same DOS. Affected claims appear on Remittance Advices (RAs) with internal control numbers (ICNs) beginning with region code 56. Providers are encouraged to bill appropriately under Medicaid NCCI guidelines. 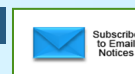
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
