Coverage updates to the Family Planning Eligibility Program

Under existing Indiana Health Coverage Programs (IHCP) medical policy, family planning services and supplies are covered benefits under the Family Planning Eligibility Program. The IHCP announced this new program and the parameters associated with covered services in BT201301 and BT201303. Coding and billing information related to coverage was also outlined.

This bulletin announces coverage updates specific to injectable contraceptive procedure codes. All other coverage information and billing instructions communicated in the previously referenced bulletins remain unchanged.

Coding and billing update

In <u>BT201301</u>, the covered procedure codes for oral and injectable drugs were outlined in Table 4.0 and included the following codes:

- J1055 Injection, medroxyprogesterone acetate for contraceptive use, 150 mg
- J1056 Injection, medroxyprogesterone acetate/estradiol cypionate, 5 mg/25 mg
- S4993 Contraceptive pills for birth control

As of December 31, 2012, procedure codes J1055 and J1056 were end-dated and, therefore, are no longer covered. Coverage continues for S4993 – *Contraceptive pills for birth control* for dates of service on or after January 1, 2013.

Effective August 1, 2013, to allow for continued coverage of injectable contraceptives under the Family Planning Eligibility Program, the IHCP is adding procedure code J1050 – *Injection, medroxyprogesterone acetate, 1 mg* to the list of covered codes under this program. Coverage for J1050 is effective for dates of service on or after January 1, 2013. When billing code J1050, providers must bill the appropriate National Drug Code (NDC) for the drug dispensed or administered for payment consideration.

Providers may resubmit claims that received denials for J1050 – *Injection, medroxyprogesterone acetate, 1 mg* for dates of service on or after January 1, 2013.
